ADJEKTIVE (Eigenschaftswörter) beziehen sich auf Hauptwörter und drücken aus, wie etwas ist.

This house is expensive.

It is an <u>expensive</u> house.

ADVERBIEN (Umstandswörter der Art und Weise) beziehen sich auf

- Zeitwörter, d.h., sie drücken aus, wie etwas gemacht wird.

She always does her work <u>carefully</u>.

- Eigenschaftswörter, d.h., sie drücken aus, wie gut/schlecht/... etwas ist.

She is an <u>extremely</u> beautiful woman.

- Adverbien, d.h., sie drücken aus, wie gut/schlecht/... etwas gemacht wird.

He does his work extremely quickly.

AUSNAHMEN

Zeitwörter, die Sinneswahrnehmungen ausdrücken This cake tastes good. These cigars smell awful. The bells sound terrible. She looks beautiful. They felt bad about it.

become, turn, grow and get in der Bedeutung von werden!
He became <u>nervous</u> when she looked at him.
She grew <u>angry</u> when she saw what had happened.
She gets <u>angry</u> whenever people do not behave well.

- seem/appear (scheinen)

They *seem* nice. (= I have got the impression that they *are* nice.)
