1. Usage

PRESENT PERFECT CONTINUOUS verwendet man, wenn von einer Handlung die Rede ist, die in der Vergangenheit begonnen hat und noch andauert!

2. Statements (Aussagesätze)

I have been studying for several hours.

You have been dancing for a long time (now).

He has been playing soccer for several years.

She has been going to this school since 1999.

They have been travelling around the world for six weeks

3. Negation (Verneinung)

I haven't (= have not) been studying for several hours.

You haven't been dancing for a long time (now).

He hasn't (= has not) been playing soccer for several years.

She hasn't been going to this school since 1999.

They haven't been travelling around the world for six weeks

4. Asking question

Have you really been studying for several hours?

Has he been playing soccer for several years?

5. Negation in questions

Haven't you already been to New York?

Have you not already been to New York?
